PARTNERS FOR FISH AND WILDLIFE PROGRAM LANDOWNER AGREEMENT

This Landowner Agreement (Agreement), dated <u>11/02/2022</u>, between <u>Ford County</u>, Ducks Unlimited, Pheasants Forever, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) is entered into pursuant to authority contained in the Partners for Fish and Wildlife Act (P.L. 109-294), the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (16 U.S.C. 661 et seq.) and the Fish and Wildlife Act of 1956 (16 U.S.C. 742a-j), as amended. This project was selected for funding because the Landowner(s) share(s) a common objective with the USFWS to restore habitat for the benefit of Federal trust species on private lands, and the project supports priority actions identified in the Regional Partners for Fish and Wildlife (Partners) Program Strategic Plan.

<u>Ford County, 200 W. State St., Paxton, IL 60957</u>, hereby agrees to participate with the USFWS in conducting certain wildlife management practices on lands owned or managed in <u>Ford County, State of Illinois</u>, described as follows: all of, or within, <u>T23N R10E Section 24.</u> 88°0'54.782''W 40°25'59.848''N (see attached maps for details).

In signing this Agreement, the Landowner(s) join(s) as a participant in a wildlife habitat improvement program and grants to the USFWS and any other cooperators signing this Agreement] authority to complete the habitat improvement project or the Landowner(s) may personally carry out management activities with financial or material support as described in attached Exhibit A. Any donation of supplies or equipment to the Landowner for carrying out the habitat improvements is included in Exhibit A. The activities conducted pursuant to this Agreement are not to replace, supplement or otherwise contribute to any mitigation or compensation that may be required of the Landowner(s) or other parties as a result of any mandated requirements.

The term of this Agreement (also referred to as the habitat retention period) will be completed on 11/02/2032. This Agreement may be modified at any time by mutual written consent of the parties. It may be terminated by either party upon 30 days advance written notice to the other party. However, if the Landowner(s) terminate(s) the Agreement before its expiration, or if the Landowner(s) should materially default on these commitments, then the Landowner(s) agree(s) to reimburse the USFWS prior to final termination for the prorated costs of all habitat improvements placed on the land through this Agreement. For these purposes, the total cost of the habitat improvements to the United States is agreed to be \$6,300.00.

Landowner:

The Landowner(s) or his/her land manager, with legal authority over land management decisions, guarantee(s) ownership of the above-described land and warrants that there are no outstanding rights that interfere with this Landowner Agreement.

The Landowner(s) will notify the USFWS of planned or pending changes in ownership. A change of ownership shall not change the terms of this Agreement. The Agreement and terms shall be in effect on the described land for the term of the Agreement.

The Landowner(s) agree(s) to allow access (with advance notice) to the USFWS to implement the project described in Exhibit A, and to monitor project success.

The Landowner(s) retain(s) all rights to control trespass and retains all responsibility for taxes, assessments, and damage claims.

During the habitat retention period, the landowner must maintain the habitat restored under this award.

At the end of the habitat retention period, the habitat improvement project will become the sole property and complete responsibility of the Landowner(s). There shall be no obligation to the USFWS after the term of the Agreement has expired.

The Landowner(s) will be responsible for securing any necessary permits. Technical advice and support will be provided by participating agencies in the application for the permit(s). The Landowner(s) agree(s) to identify USFWS contribution to the project during public presentations, reports, or other information published about the project, as appropriate.

USFWS:

The USFWS will work with the Landowner(s) throughout the entire Agreement term to support actions needed to ensure that the project is designed and constructed per the Agreement and functions as intended.

The USFWS, its agents, or assignees will provide advanced notice prior to accessing the Landowner(s) property to implement the project described in the work plan, and to monitor project success.

The USFWS assumes no liability for damage or injury other than that caused by its own negligence, on the above acreage. The USFWS does not assume jurisdiction over the premises by this Agreement.

Benefits to grassland birds include improved nesting and brood rearing cover and increased foraging opportunities based on the diverse seed mix provided by the USFWS. The project consists of converting pasture grass, brome grass, and reed canary grass to native grasses and forbs with the objective of providing wildlife habitat. This project falls within a Partners for Fish & Wildlife Program Focus Area and contributes to the program's five-year strategic plan.

USFWS will:



This letter requests comments on the amended "responsive" application filed by Canadian National Railway Company (CN) and its United States rail carrier affiliate, Illinois Central Railroad Company (ICCR) (collectively, CN), on June 9, 2022, in Docket No. FD 36500 (Sub-No. 1). In that application, ³³¹ CN requests that the Surface Transportation Board (Board) order the sale of the Kansas City Southern Railway Company's (KCS) rail line between Kansas City, Missouri and Springfield and East St. Louis, Illinois (Springfield Line) to CN (Proposed Divestiture). See attached maps. CN's filing was submitted in response to a primary application filed jointly by Canadian Pacific et al. (CP) and KCS in Docket No. FD 36500, seeking Board authority for CP to acquire KCS. ³³² The proposed acquisition of KCS by CP is the subject of a separate ongoing environmental review by the Board. ³³³ Should the Board authorize both the

application in Docket No. FD 36500 on August 5, 2022, and requested public comments on the Draft EIS by October 14, 2022. More information regarding the environmental review of the proposed acquisition of KCS by CP can be found on the project-specific website (www.CP-KCSMergerEIS.com) or on the Board's website at www.stb.gov by conducting a search for Docket No. FD 36500.

primary application and the Proposed Divestiture, then CP would be ordered to sell the Springfield Line to CN upon completion of CP's acquisition of KCS.

Before deciding whether to authorize the Proposed Divestiture, the Board must first evaluate the potential environmental impacts of CN's proposal in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) (42 U.S.C. §§ 4321-4370m-12) and the Board's environmental regulations at 49 C.F.R. Part 1105. To comply with NEPA, the Board's Office of Environmental Analysis (OEA) is conducting an environmental review of the Proposed Divestiture separately from, but concurrently with, the ongoing environmental review of the proposed acquisition of KCS by CP. Although the Proposed Divestiture could only occur if CP is authorized to acquire KCS, the environmental reviews for the two proposals are being conducted separately because they involve different railroad applicants and largely distinct sets of potential environmental impacts that would occur in different geographic areas.

The purpose of this letter is to formally announce that OEA is in the process of preparing the NEPA document and to request any comments or concerns you may have on the Proposed Divestiture. The environmental review of the Proposed Divestiture will help inform the Board in making its decision about whether to approve CN's proposal and, if so, whether and what environmental mitigation conditions to impose.

Project Description

The Proposed Divestiture proceeding requests that the Board order the sale of approximately 370 miles of KCS's Springfield Line in Missouri and Illinois. In connection with the sale of the Springfield Line, CN also seeks a 50% equity interest in KCS's International Freight Gateway terminal (IFG Terminal) south of Kansas City. See attached maps.

CN states that its proposal to acquire the Springfield Line if the Board authorizes CP to acquire KCS would preserve and enhance competition between Kansas City and Chicago; introduce new single-line rail automotive and intermodal service between Michigan/Eastern Canada and Kansas City; and establish a more direct route for rail traffic between Canada and the Midwest and East St. Louis. CN estimates that more than 80,000 long-haul trucks would be removed from the highways each year as a result of the Proposed Divestiture and that this would generate public benefits by reducing greenhouse gas emissions, highway congestion and maintenance.

According to CN, the Proposed Divestiture would involve (1) operational changes (e.g., an increase in average trains per day) on certain segments of the Springfield Line as well as some contiguous segments of CN's Gilman Line and CN's St. Louis Line that would exceed the Board's thresholds for environmental review at 49 C.F.R. § 1105.7(e) (see further discussion below); (2) changes in activity at some rail yards and intermodal facilities that would exceed the Board's thresholds for environmental review; (3) capital improvements within the existing rail right-of-way and at yards/intermodal facilities; and (4) changes at intermodal facilities that would result in an average increase of truck traffic of more than 10% of the average daily traffic or 50 vehicles a day on affected road segments.

Environmental Review

The Board's thresholds for assessing environmental impacts from increased rail traffic on rail lines in railroad acquisition proceedings are an increase in rail traffic of at least 100 percent as measured in gross ton-miles annually (GTM) or an increase in rail traffic of at least eight trains per day in areas classified as being in attainment under the Clean Air Act. For rail lines located in nonattainment areas, environmental impacts are assessed if they would experience an increase in rail traffic of at least 50 percent as measured in GTMs or an increase of at least three trains per day. 49 C.F.R. §§ 1105.7(e)(5)(i)-(ii). For the Proposed Divestiture, CN projects that the Board's environmental thresholds for GTM (but not for trains per day) would be met or exceeded along 11 rail line segments, including four segments of the KCS Springfield Line, four segments of the CN Gilman Line, and three segments of the CN St. Louis Line. See attached maps showing the overall projects and more detailed state-level maps. If you require additional or more detailed maps, please contact us. Of these line segments, CN estimates that seven are located in attainment areas and four are located in non-attainment areas. Therefore, OEA will evaluate the potential environmental impacts that could result from increased rail traffic on those 11 rail line segments.

At rail yards and intermodal facilities, the air quality thresholds include an increase of at least 100% in rail carload activity for areas classified as being in attainment or 20% in rail carload activity for areas in nonattainment. 49 C.F.R. §§ 1105.7(e)(5)(i)-(ii). CN projects that the Proposed Divesture would result in increases in operational activity that would exceed the Board's thresholds at the East St. Louis Yard/Intermodal Terminal in Illinois and at CN's Detroit Intermodal Yard in Michigan. See attached maps. Therefore, OEA will evaluate the potential environmental impacts that could result from increased operational activity at those facilities.

To support the projected increases in rail traffic, CN plans to make eight capital improvements within the existing rail right-of-way (ROW). These would include extending six existing passing sidings, adding one new siding passing, and relocating one siding passing on the Springfield Line. In Missouri, the improvements would occur at Grain Valley, Harmony, Mexico West, Bowling Green, and Blackburn; and in Illinois, improvements would occur at Pleasant Hill, Roodhouse and Cockrell. In addition, CN plans to make capital improvements at the East St. Louis Yard/Intermodal Terminal in Illinois by constructing 6,000 track feet with intermodal pads and accompanying pavement and 5,000 track feet for loading/unloading and car storage; and developing approximately 25 acres of land for necessary roadways, parking, and truck areas. At IFG Terminal in Missouri, CN proposes to construct 20,000 track feet with pad, storage and accompanying pavement, and 6,600 track feet for loading/unloading and storage, roadways and railhead parking and truck areas. At Roodhouse Yard in Illinois, CN would construct 5,000 feet of new yard track. Railroads have the right to increase efficiency by improving their rail lines and rerouting their traffic without seeking authority from the Board. Therefore, railroad capital improvements that are designed to improve operational efficiency (such as sidings, double tracking, and industry track) typically do not require Board authorization or environmental review by OEA. Where, as here, planned capital improvements are related to a proposal requiring Board approval, however, OEA considers, as appropriate, the potential environmental impacts from such planned capital improvements on a case-by-case basis. In this case, CN has stated that the planned capital improvements are necessary to accommodate the

projected increase in rail traffic and has sufficiently identified the location and general layout of the planned capital improvements to support an environmental review. Therefore, OEA will assess the potential impacts of the planned capital improvements as part of the NEPA review of the Proposed Divestiture.

Lastly, OEA will evaluate changes at intermodal facilities that would result in an average increase of truck traffic of more than 10% of the average daily traffic or 50 vehicles a day on any affected road segment. See 49 C.F.R. §§ 1105.7(e)(5)(i)-(ii). These include: IFG Terminal in Missouri; East St. Louis Intermodal Terminal in Illinois; and Detroit Intermodal Yard in Michigan.

CN projects that transaction-related rail traffic would primarily consist of intermodal containers, assembled automobiles, and carloads of grain. CN does not anticipate any transaction-related shipments of hazardous materials. Nor is CN aware of any current or foreseeable passenger rail service, including Amtrak service, on any of the 11 rail line segments to be evaluated.

In short, based on the information available to date, OEA will evaluate the potential environmental impacts associated with the increased rail traffic, increased operational activity, and capital improvements described above and compare these impacts to the No-Action Alternative, which would occur if the Board were to authorize CP to acquire KCS in Finance Docket No. 36500 but deny CN's amended responsive application for the Proposed Divestiture of the Springfield Line from CP to CN in Finance Docket No. 36500 (Sub-No. 1). OEA's environmental review will evaluate impacts from the Proposed Divestiture related to freight rail safety; rail/roadway at-grade crossing (grade crossing) safety; grade crossing delay; truck-to-rail diversions; intermodal facility traffic; noise and vibration; air quality and climate change; energy; cultural resources; hazardous materials releases sites; biological resources; water resources; environmental justice; and cumulative impacts.





- 1. The Gibson City Police Chief or Designee
- 2. The Paxton Police Chief or Designee
- 3. The Ford County E911 Director or Designee
- 4. The Gibson Area Ambulance Director or Designee
- 5. A Fire Department Representative
- 6. A Ford County Board Member
- 7. The Ford County Sheriff

II) Functions and Authority of the Oversight Board

- 1. The Ford County Sheriff shall be the permanent chairperson of the Oversight Board.
- 2. A quorum for the Oversight Board shall consist of five (5) members.
- 3. The Oversight Board shall meet at least two (2) times annually and appoint a secretary who shall keep good and sufficient minutes of the meetings.
- 4. Conduct a bi-annual performance review of the Ford County Telecommunications Center.
- 5. Evaluate and make recommendations to the Ford County Sheriff concerning policies and procedures of the Ford County Telecommunications Center.
- 6. Evaluate and make recommendations to the Ford County Sheriff concerning development, programming, operational and personnel policies and equipment usage.
- 7. Oversight Board may call a special meeting at any reasonable time to address recipient concerns involving the Ford County Telecommunications Center.
- 8. Any increase in funds for dispatch services imposed by Ford County towards the recipients must be approved by the Oversight Board by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote.

III) Admission of New Recipients

Public safety entities that are not recipients under this agreement may be added to this agreement as recipients upon meeting any terms and conditions as determined by the Oversight Board.

IV) Duration and Termination

Except as otherwise specifically provided herein, any party to this agreement may withdraw from the Oversight Board upon at least one (1) year written notice to the Oversight Board. Said termination must be received by December 1st of the year prior to the termination effective on December 1st of the following year.

V) Amendments

This agreement may be amended at any time by the majority action of the Oversight Board and ratified by the majority of the legislative bodies of all Parties of this agreement.

VI) Severability

If a provision of this agreement of application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the agreement, which can be given effect without invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of the agreement are declared to be severable.

VII) Execution of Agreement

Each party to this agreement may bind itself with all other parties to this agreement to form the Oversight Board by signing a duplicate original to the Oversight Board. It is understood that such execution shall not require that one original agreement be signed by all parties to this agreement, but that there will be several duplicate originals signed by each party to this agreement. The purpose of this provision is to facilitate the signing of this agreement and to avoid undue delay in the execution of this agreement. This agreement, however, shall be executed on behalf of each member by its authorized representative and pursuant to the appropriate motion, resolution or ordinance of each local government or other entity as the case may be. Each party to this agreement shall be bound to it as of the date it is signed by that member.

VIII) Indemnity Agreement

Each party to this agreement agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the other parties to this agreement for loss or damage of any nature arising from provision of law enforcement, fire, medical aid services and/or equipment by each party's employees or agents in aid of any other party. Specifically, action under the direction and control of a party to this agreement shall be interpreted solely as direct control of actions by the party receiving the aid. Otherwise, the primary commissioning agency remains liable or responsible for the actions of its employees or agents.

IX) Compensation

In consideration for providing emergency communications services, **Gibson Area Ambulance Service** shall pay the sum of \$20,000.00 to the Ford County Sheriffs' Office located at 235 N. American Street, Paxton, IL 60957 in equal monthly installments of \$1,666.67, due, and payable without demand by the 15th of each month. Recipients may also choose to pay one lump sum of \$20,000.00 on or about December 01, 2022.

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 01st day of December 2022, by and between the County of Ford (hereinafter referred to as County), Illinois, and the **Village of Melvin** (hereinafter referred to as Village), Illinois, a municipal corporation.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Village has the need for police protection, but does not have the economic resources with which to maintain a police department of the necessary size, nor the provisions to adequately train or equip said police department; and

WHEREAS, the County has an established modernly trained and equipped sheriffs office which could provide the required police protection and community policing programs within the corporate limits of the Village to the extent and manner hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, the Village has desired the services of a modernly trained and equipped sheriff's office which the County is able and willing to furnish said police protection; and

WHEREAS, the Village and County have reached an agreement pursuant to authority granted by Article 7, Section 10 (a) of the Illinois Constitution whereby the County would provide law enforcement services to the Village pursuant to the terms of this Contract.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of mutual promises and covenants contained herein, the following has been agreed by and between the County and the Village:

- 1. This Contract shall be operative for a period not to exceed one (1) year and shall commence the 01st day of December 2022 and shall thus expire the 30th day of November 2023.
- 2. The Village shall remit to the County the sum of \$10,646.00, Ten Thousand Six Hundred Forty-Six Dollars and 00/100, which shall be paid in accordance with one of the following listed options after the Contract has been accepted and signed by the County and Village.

Option 1: One installment of the full amount by June 01st, 2023, or

Option 2: Two installments of \$5,323.00 each; the first installment due by May 01st,

2023 and the second installment due by October 01st, 2023.

In the event the Village elects to terminate this agreement, the contract shall expire on the last day of the same month the Village Board voted to be released from the agreement.  - 2) All traffic offense fines and forfeitures within the Village shall be paid to the Village.
 - 3) Law enforcement investigative services, joint County/Village investigation or exclusive County investigations may be requested by the Village President, Village Police Committee Chairman, or the Village Chief of Police. A rate of \$55.00 (Fifty-Five and 00/100) per man-hours per individual incident. Such investigative services shall exclude any animal complaints unless such animals pose an immediate threat to the public health or safety of Village residents.
